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 ****CALIFORNIA S.B. 9876 - CHEMICAL BANS/RESTRICTIONS**

Sponsor: Senator Nancy Cirkett (D)

 **Summary:** Current version (June 23) allows the Department of Toxic Substances Control to enforce provisions prohibiting manufacture, sale, exchange, possession with the intent to sell or exchange, or offer for sale or exchange to any retailer, any product contaminated with any toxic substance.

Status: Introduced February 19, 2010. Referred to Senate Committee on Environmental Quality March 4. Hearing held, passed Committee and re-referred to Committee on Appropriations April 5. Amended April 12. Hearing held and passed committee April 26. Passed Senate April 29. Referred to Assembly Committee on Environmental Safety and Toxic Materials May 13. Hearing held, passed committee and re-referred to Committee on Appropriations June 15. Amended by sponsor on June 23.

Outlook: Appropriations Committee expected to take up the bill the week of July 19. The June 23 amendments revise the cross-reference to federal law. The Assembly Committee on Environmental Safety and Toxic Materials voted 6-2 to pass this measure. The Los Angeles District Attorney's office added its support to this measure. The Senate voted 23-10 to pass this measure, with all the NO votes coming from the Republican minority. Environmental and consumer protection groups support the measure, including CALPIRG, Clean Water Action, Environment California and Environmental Working Group. Senator Cirkett has introduced several measures aimed at removing toxins from products and has listed "protecting Californians from toxic chemicals" as a top legislative issue.
