Voters in Georgia will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, and state legislators in the 2018 election cycle. All 180 seats are up in the House and all 56 seats are up in the State Senate. They are expected to maintain control of the legislature. This state is a Republican trifecta.

Charlie Bailey previously served as a Senior Assistant District Attorney in Fulton County, and before that in the Roy Barnes Administration.

Bailey's campaign is shaped around on law and order issues. He's pledged to take on organized crime and gangs. He's attacked Attorney General Carr several times for not assigning an Assistant Attorney General to work on crime and gang activity. He supports salary raises for law enforcement.

Bailey favors universal background checks and "common sense" gun safety legislation.

He has stated that if the legislature were to pass a religious freedom bill, and if that bill were to be challenged in court, that he would [not defend](#) it if elected attorney general. He supports creating a Civil Rights Division within the Office of Attorney General.

He opposes the litigation against the Affordable Care Act that Georgia has joined. Bailey pledges to sue pharmaceutical companies that deceptively marketed opioids.

Bailey supports net neutrality.
