Voters in Arizona will elect a Governor, Attorney General, and state legislators in the 2018 election cycle. All 60 seats are up in the state House and all 30 seats are up in the state Senate. Republicans are expected to maintain their trifecta in the state.

Attorney General Mark Brnovich was first elected in 2014 after unseating former Attorney General Tom Horne (R) in the Republican primary that cycle. His re-election campaign is focused on his accomplishments as attorney general.

His office has taken legal action against opioid manufacturers and ride hailing companies. His office has helped [return](#) over \$30 million to the citizens of Arizona.

Attorney General Brnovich recently served as Chair of the Conference of Western Attorneys General (CWAG). His tenure focused on data privacy and security. Recently, his office initiated a [probe](#) into Google's privacy practices.

Attorney General Brnovich [joined](#) the multi-state suit in effort to repeal the Affordable Care Act.

He also wants to see charter school [reform](#) pass next session in the legislature. He hopes lawmakers pass a package that will allow the State Auditor General to investigate charter schools' finances and to require charters to segregate public funds from private funds.
