

## Georgia

Voters in Georgia will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, and state legislators in the 2018 election cycle. All 180 seats are up in the House and all 56 seats are up in the State Senate. They are expected to maintain control of the legislature. This state is a Republican trifecta.

Attorney General Chris Carr was appointed to the position in 2016. He previously served as Commissioner of the state's Department of Economic Development.

He has stated that protecting and upholding the rule of law is his chief goal as attorney general. He pledges to fight federal overreach at state and local levels.

Attorney General Carr's campaign is focused on fighting human trafficking and elder abuse, combatting the opioid epidemic, and consumer protection.

He created Georgia's Statewide Opioid Task Force and wants to invest more support in law enforcement officials who are working to divert illegal fentanyl drug flow.

He opposes sanctuary locality legislation. He believes the ACA to be unconstitutional. He is pro-life.
