Voters in Vermont will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General and state legislators in the 2018 election cycle. All 150 seats are up in the state House and all 30 seats are up in the state Senate. Split government control is expected to continue after the general.

Attorney General T.J. Donovan was first elected in 2016. He previously served as Chittenden County State's Attorney.

Attorney General Donovan supported the legalization of marijuana. He supports universal access to naloxone treatment and increased access to medication assisted treatment for addicts. Lastly, he supports greater access to needle exchanges.

He touts his development of the state's Rapid Intervention Community Court for non-violent offenders whose crimes are driven by addiction or mental illness. He also supports ban the box legislation.

Attorney General Donovan has stated that environmental protection is one of his top priorities. He recently joined a coalition of attorneys general in a statement announcing an intention to challenge the roll back in greenhouse gas emission and fuel economy standards.

Attorney General Donovan has filed suit against an opioid manufacturer and has the support of current Governor Phil Scott (R) on the issue.

Trivia: Attorney General Donovan started his career as an Assistant District Attorney in Philadelphia.
