Voters in Massachusetts will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, and state legislators in the 2018 election cycle. All 160 seats are up in the state Assembly and all 40 seats are up in the state Senate. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the governorship while Democrats are expected to maintain control of legislature.

Attorney General Maura Healey was first elected in 2014 and became the first openly gay attorney general in the nation. Part of her campaign's platform is a resistance to the Trump Administration.

Attorney General Healey was first AG to file suit in the Equifax breach. She joined the DACA suit last year and sued the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services over new rules that would deny birth control coverage.

Attorney General Healey [filed](#) suit against an opioid manufacturer in June 2018 and has stated that its board members and executives marketed opiates knowing that they are highly addictive. She also recently announced an investigation into an e-cigarette company and online sellers of their products.

She opposes the attempted repeal of the Clean Power Plan and has called for a state plan on [electric vehicles](#) and clean energy goals.
