Henderson is campaigning on public education issues, specifically raising teacher pay. He supports the state's Medicaid program – Arkansas Works. He also wants to work to reduce the state's poverty rate. Recently, he outlined an <u>ethics</u> reform plan that includes additional wait time for former legislators to register as lobbyists and banning corporations from donating to political action committees.

Thus far, his campaign has done its best to avoid discussion of social issues though it will be brought up in the general.
