Voters in Oklahoma will elect a Governor and Lt. Governor, Attorney General, and state legislators in the 2018 election cycle. All 101 seats are up in the House and 24 out of 48 seats are up in the Senate. Republicans currently have a trifecta and will maintain control of the legislature.

Attorney General Mike Hunter was appointed to the Office of Attorney General in 2017. He survived a Republican primary runoff that supplied opposition research to his eventual Democratic opponent. Attorney General Hunter calls himself an ardent support of the Constitution and protecting the 10th Amendment is a central theme to his re-election campaign.

He is campaigning on fighting for victims' rights, protecting consumers' rights, and protecting the elderly and unborn.

He is also running to crack down on the opioid epidemic. His website states that, "an obsession on profits by some drug manufacturers has led to an oversupply and overuse of these drugs." He wants to focus on drug abuse education and prevention and treatment programs.
