Voters in Iowa will elect a Governor and Lt. Governor, Attorney General, and state legislators in the 2018 election cycle. All 100 seats in the State House are up as well as 25 of the 50 seats in the State Senate. Iowa is a battleground state this cycle with Republicans on defense and Democrats hoping to pick up 10 seats in the House and six in the Senate to flip both chambers.

Attorney General Tom Miller is currently serving his ninth term as the state's top lawyer and he is running unopposed in the general election. Attorney General Miller's priorities are consumer advocacy and protection, Iowa farmers' interests, and protecting the public from crime.

Recently, his office joined a suit challenging the Trump administration's family separation policy.

He joined a letter urging Congress pass the CARA 2.0 and CARES Act and stated that opioid manufacturers ignored responsibilities leading up to the epidemic. When confirming his run for his tenth term, he stated that there was unfinished business including work on opioids and for-profit colleges.

He is part of coalition of states, counties, and cities defending the Clean Power Plan.

Attorney General Miller support net neutrality rules. Regarding firearms, he has urged Congress to close the "bump stock" loophole.

Trivia: Attorney General Miller is the nation's longest serving AG.
