Voters in Oklahoma will elect a Governor and Lt. Governor, Attorney General, and state legislators in the 2018 election cycle. All 101 seats are up in the House and 24 out of 48 seats are up in the Senate. Republicans currently have a trifecta and will maintain control of the legislature.

Kevin Stitt secured the Republican nomination for governor after a tough August runoff with the former Oklahoma City Mayor. Stitt, a businessman, ran as a political outsider in the primary. He's running a campaign that pledges to bring his business experiences to the Governor's Mansion. His campaign's motto is: Oklahoma's Turnaround Starts Now.

He's running on a Five Pillars Plan. Stitt wants to streamline agencies, board, and commissions. He has pledged to audit each state agency and to require a line item budget that will be made public. He wants to raise teacher pay and expand Advanced Placement classes via distance learning.

Stitt has [stated](#) that Oklahoma can capitalize on the Trump Tax Cut and diversify its economy. He also supports licensing reform including removing fees and eliminating certain requirements.

Stitt has also pledged to implement a comprehensive, long-term infrastructure plan.

He supports telemedicine and selling health insurance across state lines.

He promises to promote agriculture by protecting landowners' rights and protecting ranchers from out of state animal rights groups.
