Voters in Kansas will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, and state legislators in the 2018 election cycle. All 125 seats are up in the House. Republicans have a trifecta in the state and should maintain control of the legislature.

Sarah Swain

Sarah Swain is a criminal defense attorney and previously served in the Johnson County Public Defender's Office. She is campaigning on law and order issues.

Swain has pledged to take on predatory lenders including those companies that have "aggressive" debt collection tactics.

She supports greater inclusion in the state's civil rights laws.

She has pledged to create educational, consumer protection and investor task forces on cryptocurrency and blockchain technology.

Swain supports the decriminalization of marijuana and hemp agriculture.

Swain has self-inflicted wounds since announcing her run. After a controversial piece of art in her law office was exposed, the state Democratic Party called for her to end her campaign for the Office of Attorney General. It depicts Wonder Woman lassoing a police officer. When asked about the poster, Swain stated, "I understand that this picture has been misconstrued by many as advocating for violence against the police, and for that I apologize. I am not anti-law enforcement; I am pro-truth. And I do not condone violence in any form."
