## **Governor Scott Walker**

Governor Scott Walker was first elected in 2010 and became the first governor in the nation to survive a recall election in 2012. Governor Walker is a crafty politician and is great on the trail. He has been prepping for a tough race, tweeting back in April that the Republican Party needed to get in gear after a liberal candidate won an election to the Wisconsin Supreme Court.

He's running on his record as governor coupled with traditional conservative values. Governor Walker is touting his success in balancing the budget this session leading the state to cut taxes. He's campaigning on the addition \$200 per child in education funding and the investment made in technical schools.

Governor Walker is also running on healthcare accomplishments including the investment of \$200 million in market-based solutions to bring down insurance costs.

He is in favor of expanding youth apprenticeships to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders. He supports increased investment including broadband in rural school districts. He has pledged to continue the tuition freeze on University of Wisconsin campuses and a tax credit of up to \$5,000 over five years for graduates that stay in the state.
