

## Pennsylvania

Voters in Pennsylvania will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, and state legislators in the 2018 election cycle. All 203 seats are up in the House and 25 out of 50 seats are up in the Senate. Republicans have control of the Legislature and are expected to maintain it in November.

### Governor

Governor Tom Wolf was first elected in 2014. He is seeking re-election and running on his record, willingness to work across the aisle. Governor Wolf and Senator Wagner began negative ad blitzes in July.

Education funding is becoming a larger part of the campaign – he has hit his opponent on his prior support of former Governor Corbett’s cuts and has even made a website dedicated to the singular issue. His campaign states that as Governor he enacted a fair funding formula and has invested more in Pre-K.

Governor Wolf supports clean energy including solar. He supports banning fracking in the Delaware River Basin. He has been a vocal opponent of the Trump Administration’s EPA roll-backs and policies.

Governor Wolf approved funding through the Manufacturing PA initiative for seven new training programs. He supports raising the state’s minimum wage to \$12. He also established the PA Business One-Stop Shop for small business entrepreneurs.

As a vocal opponent of the President, the campaign is also highlighting the differences between the Trump and Wolf Administrations. His campaign is tying his opponent to President Trump even though Trump won the state in 2016.
