

Louisiana

Voters in Louisiana will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, and Attorney General this cycle. All 105 House seats will be on the ballot as well as all 39 Senate seats. Republicans are expected to maintain control of both chambers. Democrats will be defending the Governor's Office while Republicans will be defending the Office of the Attorney General.

Attorney General

Attorney General Jeff Landry (R) was first elected in 2015. During his first term in office he also served as President of the National Association of Attorneys General (NAAG). He previously served one term in Congress.

Attorney General Landry is running on his record as the state's top lawyer. He has cited his establishment of the Louisiana Bureau of Investigation and encouragement of the Fugitive Apprehension as part of his efforts to safeguard citizens from crime.

He supports the repeal of the WOTUS rule.

He has joined a lawsuit against Massachusetts' efforts to regulate farming and has been a vocal opponent of the California egg proposition citing that it will hurt Louisiana egg farmers.

Attorney General Landry is pushing to ensure states can regulate pharmacy benefits managers and has filed an amicus brief with the U.S. Supreme Court on the issue. He has also joined a suit against prescription drug manufacturers accusing companies of price fixing.

He is pro-life. He is pro-second amendment rights and supports legislation that would lead to nation-wide concealed carry. He opposes sanctuary localities and supports building a border wall.

Attorney General Landry joined the Louisiana National Guard in high school. He is a Desert Storm veteran and rose to rank of Sergeant. He is married with one child.
