Voters in Nevada will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, and Attorney General this cycle. All 42 House seats will be on the ballot as well as half (11) the Senate seats. All races are expected to be competitive.

Sigal Chattah

Sigal Chattah (R) has served as a Planning Commissioner and a member of the Southern Nevada Disciplinary Board of the State Bar of Nevada. This is her first bid for an elected office.

She is running on a <u>platform</u> aimed to bolster second amendment laws, defend freedom of religion, and protect Nevadans from prescription price gouging.

Chattah <u>supports</u> increasing the funding for Nevada police departments and implementing mandatory minimums for felons in possession and prohibited possessors.

She <u>pledges</u> to lobby for a Parents' Bill of Rights and <u>opposes</u> critical race theory being taught in public schools.

Chattah uses anti-tech rhetoric on her website voicing her opposition to attempted censorship.

She has sued Governor Sisolak (D) and Attorney General Aaron Ford (D) numerous times over COVD-19 mitigation measures including mask mandates. Chattah believes that the restrictions and shutdowns were a deviation from the Constitution.

At this time, no debates have been scheduled between Chattah and Ford.

Trivia: Chattah was brown in Israel and immigrated to Nevada with her family when she was 14 years old.
