

OKLAHOMA

Voters in Oklahoma will elect a Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and an Attorney General this cycle. All 101 House seats will be on the ballot, as well as 24 Senate seats. Republicans are expected to maintain control of all branches of government.

Attorney General

Republican Nominee

Gentner Drummond (R)

Gentner Drummond defeated incumbent Attorney General John O'Connor (R) by a narrow margin in June's Republican primary.

This marks Drummond's second run for the office: In 2018 he lost in the Republican primary to eventual Attorney General Mike Hunter (R) who later resigned.

Drummond served as a pilot and mission commander in the U.S. Air Force during the Gulf War. After returning home, he completed his law degree from Georgetown University and founded The Drummond Law Firm. He also serves as the principal shareholder of Blue Sky Bank.

If elected, he <u>pledges</u> to protect the people of Oklahoma against overreach by the federal government. He plans to clear rape-kit backlogs as quickly as possible so that perpetrators can be brought to justice.

Drummond <u>claims</u> that his state needs a public official who will answer to the people instead of interest groups or politicians.

Trivia: while serving in the U.S. Air Force, Drummonds received numerous medals including The Distinguished Flying Cross and The Air Force Commendation Medal.
