

## **NEW YORK**

Voters in New York will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, and Attorney General this cycle. All 150 Assembly seats will be on the ballot as well as all 63 Senate seats. Democrats are expected to maintain control of the Governor's Office, the Office of the Attorney General, and the Legislature.

## Attorney General Republican Nominee

Michael Henry (R)

Attorney General candidate Michael Henry (R) is a New-York based attorney practicing commercial litigation. During law school, Henry was a judicial intern for The Honorable John M. Czygier, Jr., Suffolk County Surrogate's Court. Throughout his career Heny has written on a variety of topics including immigration and public policy.

Henry claims that New York's rise in crime is the result of bail reform supported by his opponent, Attorney General Letitia James. If elected to office, Henry <u>plans</u> to work with police, local prosecutors, and communities to provide resources needed to reduce violence.

Henry <u>states</u> that he would root out corruption in Albany and heighten transparency by partnering with local prosecutors. If elected, he plans to restructure the Attorney General's Public Integrity Division.

He promises to launch a criminal investigation into the state's nursing homes' responses to COVID-19, first investigated by Attorney General James.
