Voters in Iowa will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, and Attorney General this cycle. All 100 Iowa State House seats will be on the ballot as well as all half of the Senate seats (25). Republicans are expected to maintain control of both the Governor's Office and the legislature while the race for Attorney General is expected to be competitive.

Attorney General Tom Miller (D)

Attorney General Tom Miller (D) has held his position since 1995. He also served as Attorney General from 1979-1991. He served as city attorney for McGregor and Marquette and has spent time in private legal practice.

One of Miller's <u>priorities</u> has been public safety. His office has focused on addressing juvenile crime and making improvements to the state's juvenile justice system.

Miller has also prioritized the <u>protection</u> of consumers in his state. The Consumer Protection Division of his office has been tasked with handling a wide range of consumer issues including improper debt collection practices and telemarketing fraud.

When he first took office in 1979, Miller <u>established</u> the Farm Division, which has led in cases against agricultural chemical companies and worked to protect the interest of farmers throughout the state.

Miller has worked to reduce the health and financial consequences of tobacco addition. In 1998 he led a multistate <u>settlement</u> against the tobacco industry that resulted in billions of dollars paid to the states and major changes to the way the industry operates.

He has also <u>addressed</u> the state's opioid crisis, challenging and suing manufacturers and distributors.

Trivia: Miller is the longest currently serving attorney general in the nation.
