Voters in Idaho will elect a Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Attorney General this cycle. All 70 House seats will be on the ballot, as all 35 Senate seats. Republicans will maintain control of both executive offices and legislative chambers.

Attorney General Republican Nominee

Raúl Labrador

Raúl Labrador defeated the state's current Attorney General in the Republican primary in May. He is a former congressman and was a founding member of the House Freedom Caucus. Labrador also previously served in the Idaho Legislator. During his political career, he has been supportive of staunchly conservative policies.

In his campaign announcement, Labrador stated that he will defend Idaho's sovereignty and protect the individual rights of Idaho's citizens. He has pledged to ensure conservative legislators have a true partner in the Attorney General's office. He has been critical of the Biden Administration and has pledged to use the power of the OAG to interfere with its policy agenda.

He vehemently disagrees with the Biden Administration's immigration policies. He has touted his work on the issue including an immigration enforcement bill that would have added more than 10,000 additional armed federal immigration officers, penalized sanctuary cities, allowed local police to assist in federal immigration enforcement, and imposed new criminal penalties for immigration violators.

Labrador has also pledged to make changes to the inner working of the OAG. He has noted that it is the largest law firm in the state but not the best. If elected he will once again <u>create</u> a Solicitor General position to argue in appellate courts on behalf of the state.
