

SOUTH CAROLINA

Voters in South Carolina will elect a Governor, Lt. Governor, and Attorney General this cycle. All 124 House seats will also be on the ballot. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the Governor's Office, Office of the Attorney General, and the legislature.

Attorney General Alan Wilson

Attorney General Alan Wilson (R) is looking to secure another term this November after serving in the position since 2011. Wilson – like a majority of South Carolina voters – holds traditional conservative values and has continuously challenged federal rules and laws that do not align with them.

His tenure includes legal battles to block same-sex marriage in South Carolina and overturn the Affordable Care Act. He issued an opinion in early 2022 stating that South Carolina doctors have the authority to prescribe off-label drugs like Ivermectin to treat COVID-19.

After the November 2020 elections, Wilson and 16 other attorneys general signed an <u>amicus</u> <u>brief</u> to the U.S. Supreme Court in support of a <u>lawsuit</u> filed by Texas that contested the presidential election results of four states in the 2020 election. Earlier this year, Wilson was endorsed by former President Donald Trump for his upcoming race.

Running uncontested in the upcoming general election, Wilson is on the path to secure his fourth term in the office.

Trivia: When he was elected as South Carolina's Attorney General in 2010, Wilson became the nation's youngest Attorney General.
