Voters in Wisconsin this year will elect a governor, lieutenant governor, and attorney general. All 33 seats in the State Senate and all 99 seats in the State House will be on the ballot as well. The gubernatorial and attorney general contests are expected to be competitive. Republican anticipate maintaining control of the legislature.

Governor Tony Evers

Governor Tony Evers (D) was elected to his position in 2018, when he defeated incumbent Governor Scott Walker (R) by a narrow margin. Previously he served as Wisconsin's Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction and president of the Council of Chief State School Officers.

His top priorities include improving Wisconsin's public school system, making health care more affordable, and fixing the state's transportation infrastructure.

If reelected, Evers <u>plans</u> to support increasing aid to schools, expanding job training and apprenticeship programs, improving financial literacy, and investing in mental health programming and special education.

He states that he will <u>address</u> rising costs of living in Wisconsin through gas price and prescription drug relief, supporting SeniorCare, tax credits, and income tax cuts.

Evers hopes to <u>improve</u> the state's infrastructure by expanding high-speed internet access to an additional 300,000 homes. He will continue to work to pass the CLEAR Act, establishing stricter standards for PFAS and funding for remediation efforts, and support infrastructure projects to replace lead service lines across the state.

Evers <u>supports</u> universal background checks and red flag laws. He wants to invest in services such as school and out-of-school programs, support additional programming in high-crime areas, as well as addiction and mental health treatment.

He <u>plans</u> to expand BadgerCare and initiatives that aim to lower healthcare costs. Evers is an advocate for reform and transparency in drug pricing: He has formed an initiative called the "Less for Rx" plan that would lower prescription drug costs.

Evers <u>hopes</u> to support small business by expanding access to capital and repealing the personal property tax. He additionally plans to work with small businesses to create new local markets for Wisconsin-made products.
