Voters in Connecticut this year will elect a governor, lieutenant governor, and attorney general. All 36 seats in the State Senate and all 151 seats in the House will be on the ballot as well. Democrats are expected to maintain control of the Governor's Office, Office of the Attorney General, and the legislature.

Attorney General Republican Nominee

Jessica Kordas

Jessica Kordas (R) is running for her first position in public office. She has worked as a trial layer in both criminal and civil cases. She believes her experience as an attorney and her background managing medical facilities and assisting financial traders qualify her for the attorney general's office.

If elected, she <u>plans</u> to advocate parents' rights, freedom of speech, and government accountability, stating that the office of the Attorney General cannot longer be a platform for self-interested politicians.

Kordas was involved in contesting mask mandates during the COVID-19 pandemic.
