

## **WYOMING**

Voters in Wyoming will elect a governor this cycle. The attorney general is appointed by the governor. All 60 House seats will be on the ballot as well as half (15) the Senate seats. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the Governor's Office, Office of Attorney General, and the legislature.

## **Democratic Nominee**

Theresa Livingston

Theresa "Terry" Livingston (D) is looking to unseat Governor Mark Gordon (R) in what would be her first election to office. Livingston ran for Wyoming State Senate's District 20 seat in 2020 but was defeated by now State Senator Edward Cooper (R). She worked for the Bureau of Land Management for 15 years and is an Air Force veteran.

Livingston is <u>concentrated</u> on health care and renewable energy in her campaign. She says her number one priority if elected would be to expand Medicaid, and she supports subsidizing hospitals for the cost of childbirth after two labor and delivery units closed in the state. She envisions the state moving past fossil fuels and would support an income tax for higher earners.

On the economic front, she supports moving away from Wyoming's "right to work" state status and focusing more on tourism, outdoor recreation, and boosting historical sites to visit.

At the end of August, Livingston <u>reported</u> raising \$1,700 with no expenditures as of yet. A gubernatorial debate has been scheduled by WyomingPBS for October 13.

Trivia: Apart from living in Wyoming, Livingston has lived in Taiwan, Turkey, Spain, and Germany, as well as Alaska, Texas, New Mexico, Montana, and Florida.
