Voters in Massachusetts will elect a governor and attorney general this cycle. All 160 House seats will be on the ballot as well as all 40 Senate seats. Democrats are expected to maintain control of the Governor's Office, Office of Attorney General, and the legislature.

Attorney General Republican Nominee

James McMahon

James McMahon (R) is a trial lawyer and former law enforcement officer. He worked for over 12 years in corporate management before starting his own law practice out of Bourne, Massachusetts.

If elected, McMahon <u>vows</u> to prioritize public safety and address what he believes is government corruption. He intends to encourage the hiring of more police officers if elected.

He <u>plans</u> to work on abolishing sanctuary cities in Massachusetts and rescind any remaining COVID-19 vaccine-related mandates.

McMahon <u>promises</u> to address the opioid epidemic and direct funding into rehabilitation programs.

He supports joining litigation to keep union members from being fired over vaccine mandates and would initiate lawsuits to recover the jobs of those who were terminated.

Running unopposed in his respective primary, McMahon has been able to spend less than what he brings in. At the end of August, he reported having a little over \$21,000 on hand.

He has challenged opponent Andrea Campbell (D) to several debates before the general election, although no debate is on the books yet.

Trivia: McMahon has litigated cases at every level in the Massachusetts Court system.
