Voters in Delaware will elect an attorney general this cycle. All 41 House seats are on the ballot as well as half (10) of the Senate. Democrats are expected to maintain control of the Office of Attorney General and the legislature.

Julianne Murray is an attorney and former candidate for Delaware Governor. She electrified Republicans by unexpectedly securing 40% of the vote in her bid for governor in 2018 and is looking to do the same in her race for the Attorney General office this November.

Murray is prioritizing public safety and the prosecution of gun crimes in her campaign. She has been [critical](#) of opponent and incumbent Attorney General Jennings (D) for not maintaining a higher prosecution rate and has vowed to increase prosecutions if elected.

As a law-and-order candidate, she has [promised](#) to oppose all attempts at defunding police departments and opposes requiring officers to use non-lethal weapons.

On the issue of reproductive rights, Murray supports the Supreme Court's decision to make abortion a state issue, but [maintains](#) that in this role she would make the job about public safety, crime, and guns.

More recently, Murray helped lead a challenge to negate Delaware's new Vote-by-Mail law, stating that the system was unconstitutional under the Delaware Constitution. In her debate against Jennings, Murray [used](#) this win as an opportunity to paint herself as the candidate who would focus on upholding the state constitution.
