Voters in Minnesota this year will elect a governor, lieutenant governor, and attorney general. All 67 seats in the State Senate and all 134 seats in the State House will be on the ballot. While all races are expected to be competitive, including control of the legislature, Democrats have an edge in the race for governor.

Attorney General Republican Nominee

Jim Schultz

Jim Schultz (R) won the Republican Party's nomination for Attorney General with 53 percent of the vote. He serves on the board of The Front Line Foundation, a nonprofit organization that supports first responders. He has worked in private law practice at two prominent law firms in Minnesota, specializing in business, regulatory, and compliance law.

If elected, Schultz <u>pledges</u> to prioritize public safety by supporting law enforcement and prosecuting criminals. His central messaging is tied to crime and civil justice.

He <u>promises</u> to protect the interests of entrepreneurs and small businesses from government overreach and "big tech" monopolies. He will work to prosecute fraud and address abuses of seniors and nursing home residents.

Schultz has been endorsed by 22 county sheriffs from across the state.

Trivia: During law school, Schultz participated in an honors program within the Department of Defense at the Pentagon.
