Voters in Wisconsin this year will elect a governor, lieutenant governor, and attorney general. All 33 seats in the State Senate and all 99 seats in the State House will be on the ballot as well. The gubernatorial and attorney general contests are expected to be competitive. Republican anticipate maintaining control of the legislature.

Attorney General Republican Nominee

Eric Toney

Eric Toney (R) is serving in his tenth year as Fond du Lac County District Attorney and is currently the President of the Wisconsin District Attorneys Association. Toney holds traditional conservative values: He supports second amendment rights, opposes access to abortion, and promises to oppose federal overreach.

Toney <u>supports</u> Qualified Immunity for law enforcement, and if elected plans to oppose any attempts to repeal it.

If elected, Toney <u>plans</u> to rescind cuts that Attorney General Josh Kaul (D) has made to the Department of Justice's Criminal Litigation Department.

He <u>claims</u> that he has prosecuted more election fraud than anyone else in the state and promises to continue to ensure all ballots are "treated equally regardless of where they are cast."

Additionally, Toney supports curtailing "unlawful" administrative overreach. Wisconsin law limits administrative agency authority to that which is explicitly granted by statute. Anything not explicitly granted by statute must go through the rule making process. Toney will require agencies to abide by this.
