

## MISSISSIPPI

Voters in Mississippi this year will elect a governor, lieutenant governor, and attorney general. All 122 seats in the house and all 52 seats in the senate will also be on the ballot in November. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the legislature and executive offices.

### Attorney General

#### Democratic Nominee

Greta Martin

Martin decided to enter the race following the *Dobbs* decision (Attorney General Fitch represented the state in the case). She currently serves as the Litigation Director for Disability Rights Mississippi, the protection and advocacy agency for the state of Mississippi. Prior to this, Martin held other roles focused on equality litigation. She received a Bachelor of Applied Science in Criminal Justice and Corrections from the University of Mississippi and a juris doctorate from Mississippi College.

If elected, Martin plans to prosecute corruption within state government, lower healthcare costs, enforce labor laws, and focus on state cases within Mississippi. She hopes to expand opportunities for women within the state by advocating for an equal pay law, preventing workplace harassment, and prosecuting domestic violence.

Martin has addressed public safety and law enforcement issues, supporting a statewide requirement for police officers to wear body worn cameras and advocating for policies to prevent people suffering from mental illness from being held in a jail.

Martin plans to establish a fair labor division within the Office of the Attorney General to investigate and litigate child labor, wage violations, and unsafe working conditions cases.

To address the ongoing public welfare corruption scandal within the state, Martin would transfer the case and accompanying investigations back to the Office of Attorney General rather than private law firms.
