

LOUISIANA

Voters in Louisiana will elect a governor, Lt. governor, and attorney general this cycle. All 105 house seats will be on the ballot as well as all 39 senate seats. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the legislature and the Office of the Attorney General. The open seat gubernatorial race is considered competitive as current Democratic Governor John Bel Edwards is termed out.

Attorney General

Lindsey Cheek (D)

In her first run for public office, Lindsey Cheek (D) is one of two Democratic candidates in the nonpartisan primary for Attorney General of Louisiana.

Cheek has worked as an attorney with the Cheek Law Firm and the Lanier Law Firm, PLLC. She has also worked as a clerk with the Harris County District Attorney and as a business consultant.

Cheek is pledging to implement policies and regulations that promote transparency in homeowners, automotive, and flood insurance transactions; disclosure of information to policyholders; and accountability for insurers and intermediaries.

She is an advocate for recidivism programs and hopes to see the state invest more in reintegration.

Ahead of the primary, Cheek was endorsed by the Louisiana Democratic Party, the Independent Women's Organization and the Democratic Attorneys General Association (DAGA).
