

## KENTUCKY

Voters in Kentucky will elect a governor and attorney general this cycle. Democrats will be defending the governor's mansion in a competitive race. Republicans are defending the office of attorney general in a competitive race.

### Attorney General

#### Democratic Nominee

#### State Representative Pamela Stevenson (D)

State Representative Pamela Stevenson (D) has served in the State Capitol since 2021 and is currently in her second term in the office. Stevenson was born and raised in the Commonwealth and served in the U.S. Air Force for 27 years. Her career experience includes working as an adjunct professor with the University of Louisville Brandeis School of Law and as a lawyer with Stevenson & Stevenson.

Stevenson's campaign has highlighted her experience in the air force, including prosecuting crimes, representing service members and the Air Force in civil matters, and teaching human rights and justice.

She has vowed to prioritize the prosecution of human traffickers and sexual predators, protect kids online, and advocate for federal resources that support local law enforcement and community organizations.

Reproductive rights are a central issue on the campaign trail in Kentucky this cycle, and Stevenson has pushed back against opponent Russell Coleman (R) for what she calls his lack of support on the issue.

Stevenson's campaign ended the primary season with \$127,000 cash on hand. Her campaign has been greatly supported by the DAGA Kentucky People's Lawyer Project, a PAC from the Democratic Attorneys General Association, with over \$105,000 being raised.
