
Artificial intelligence is a hot topic for state legislatures this year.

Terms like *synthetic media*, *digital replica*, *deepfakes* and *generative AI* are common in numerous legislative introductions. By mid-2024, it's evident that while states are eager to join the AI debate, they are cautious about comprehensive regulation. Early regulation of this broad and transformative technology could deter tech companies and their significant economic contributions.

Targeting the Threat: Deepfakes Drive AI Regulation

Although states hesitated to legislate Al broadly this past session, aspects of generative Al, like deepfakes, have emerged as prime targets. Taylor Swift's recent victimization by pornographic deepfakes has heightened public and legislative awareness of the need for stricter generative Al regulations. This type of legislation is relevant, headline-grabbing, and relatively safe for lawmakers seeking a proactive yet cautious approach to Al. These legislative proposals pose less risk of industry disruption and also address politicians' concerns about Al's impacts on elections approaching.

A Closer Look: New York's Ambitious Push to Lead in Al

Governor Kathy Hochul (D) has announced the launch of Empire AI, a consortium of New York schools dedicated to advancing AI innovation, funded with \$400 million from public and private sources. This initiative aims to establish New York as a leader in AI by creating jobs, fostering research, and ensuring academia's role in AI development. Alongside Empire AI, the state has implemented policies to protect against deepfakes and fund digital chip manufacturing. Building on prior efforts like New York City's AI Action Plan and state-wide AI usage policies, the initiative reflects a growing focus on responsibly integrating AI across various sectors.
