Voters in the Keystone State will elect a new attorney general and state treasurer in 2024. All 203 seats in the state house as well as 25 of 50 state senate seats will also be on the ballot in November. Legislative races as well as the executive offices are considered toss-ups.

Attorney General

Dave Sunday

Dave Sunday (R) is serving his second term as District Attorney for York County. He has been a prosecutor with the York County District Attorney's Office for 15 years and previously served as the Chief Deputy Prosecutor of Litigation. In 2013, he was appointed as a Special Assistant United States Attorney for the Middle District of Pennsylvania to prosecute gang, firearms, and drug cases in federal court. Prior to his courtroom career, Sunday served in the U.S. Navy.

Sunday is running a <u>tough on crime campaign</u> with his <u>prosecutorial experience</u> as a cornerstone. Addressing the **opioid epidemic** and **fentanyl**, preventing **financial crime** against elders, decreasing **gang violence**, and stopping **online child predators** are his <u>top priorities</u> for office. Mental health is <u>another priority</u>.

He believes <u>prosecutions for illegal firearm possession</u> are essential to preventing other crimes. Referencing his work in York County, Sunday often advocates for a <u>collaborative</u> approach to addressing these priorities through "accountability and redemption."

When <u>asked about reproductive healthcare</u>, Sunday did not offer an opinion, although he stated the state constitution <u>does not</u> provide a right to abortion access, and instead reaffirmed his intent to enforce whatever law is enacted by the state legislature.

Sunday has been endorsed by Congressman Lloyd Smucker (R-PA-11), State Treasurer Stacy Garrity, and the Republican Attorneys General Association (RAGA).

Trivia: During his military service, Sunday was deployed to the Persian Gulf and South America.
