Indiana voters will head to the polls this November to elect their candidate for treasurer. All 100 house seats are on the ballot along with 25 of the 50 senate seats. Republicans are expected to maintain their stronghold on the state.

Democratic Nominee

Coumba Kebe

Coumba Kebe (D) ran unopposed for the Democratic nomination for treasurer and was officially nominated at the party convention on June 6. Kebe entered the treasurer's race after narrowly losing the Democratic nomination for state House District 29 to Devon Wellington, 54% to 46%. She brings a background in public health and healthcare operations to the candidacy.

If elected, Kebe has said she will bring a "people-centered" approach to the treasurer's office, emphasizing **transparency** and accessibility so Hoosiers better understand how their tax dollars are being managed and invested.

She envisions the treasurer's role as a platform for elevating conversations around workforce shortages, an aging population, and healthcare access as meaningful indicators of economic health.
