Indiana voters will head to the polls this November to elect their candidate for treasurer. All 100 house seats are on the ballot along with 25 of the 50 senate seats. Republicans are expected to maintain their stronghold on the state.

Treasurer Daniel Elliot

Indiana Treasurer Daniel Elliott (R) is running for reelection after first taking office in January 2023. He was nominated to seek a second term at the 2026 Indiana Republican Party State Convention on June 20.

Before entering public service, Elliott spent several years as a software architect before founding his own software company. He has said those experiences gave him firsthand insight into the challenges rural counties face around broadband access and the need for government transparency and reduced bureaucracy.

Elliott previously served as chairman of the Morgan County Republican Party for a decade and has positioned himself as a consistent advocate for conservative values.

His campaign centers on his [record in office](#), which includes leading the state to earn \$1.24 billion in general fund investments and overseeing the management of more than \$16 billion in daily assets as the state's chief investment officer.

As treasurer, Elliott also serves in several statutory leadership roles, including as chair of the Indiana Bond Bank, the Statewide E-911 Board, the Indiana Education Savings Authority, and the ABLE Authority, as well as sole trustee of the State Police Pension Trust, among other positions.
