

ALABAMA

Voters in Alabama will select a new governor this year following term-limited Governor Kay Ivey's (R) exit from office. Voters will also choose a lieutenant governor, attorney general, and treasurer. All 105 house seats will be on the ballot as well as all 35 senate seats. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the executive offices and legislature.

Attorney General

Democratic Nominee

Former Alabama State Representative Jeffrey McLaughlin ran unopposed in the Democratic primary for attorney general. He served in the Alabama House of Representatives from 2001 to 2011, representing the 27th District. Most recently, he sought election as the Mayor of Guntersville, Alabama in 2025, but was defeated in a runoff election by incumbent Leigh Dollar. His professional background includes work as an attorney and law clerk.

McLaughlin entered the attorney general race late, following his loss in the September mayoral runoff. He does not currently maintain an active campaign website for the attorney general race, though his mayoral [campaign site](#) remains online. That campaign's priorities include improving schools and supporting teachers, reducing wasteful spending, encouraging small business growth, ensuring competitive pay and benefits for first responders, and addressing traffic safety.

McLaughlin faces long odds in November. **Sabato's Crystal Ball rates the race as solid Republican**, and his limited campaign presence and fundraising make a general election victory unlikely.

Trivia: McLaughlin maintains that he has never accepted campaign contributions.
