Nebraska voters will elect a governor, lieutenant governor, attorney general, and state treasurer in 2026. Twenty-five (25) of the 49 seats in Nebraska's unicameral legislature are up for election. Republicans currently hold every statewide executive office, maintain a dominant position in state government, and are expected to retain control after November.

Jocelyn Brasher

Jocelyn Brasher is an attorney, former prosecutor, and former Assistant Nebraska Attorney General. She later served as a county prosecutor and private litigator before launching her campaign.

Brasher spent five years in the Nebraska Attorney General's Consumer Protection Bureau, where she worked on consumer fraud cases, multistate investigations, and enforcement actions that secured roughly \$36 million in consumer settlements.

Brasher [argues](#) that the Attorney General's Office should serve as an independent watchdog for Nebraskans by **protecting consumers from fraud, unfair business practices, and anti-competitive behavior** while helping keep everyday costs affordable for families.

She also emphasizes **strengthening public safety** through support for law enforcement, tougher efforts against crimes targeting children, and initiatives to address online threats.

She advocates making healthcare more accessible and affordable, placing patients at the center of policy decisions and ensuring that Nebraskans can access the services they need.
