In addition to an open-seat governor's race, Ohio voters will choose a new attorney general, secretary of state, state auditor, and state treasurer. All 99 seats in the house and 17 of the 33 seats in the senate are also on the ballot. The gubernatorial race is expected to be competitive while Republicans anticipate maintaining control of other executive offices and the legislature.

John Kulewicz

John Kulewicz is an Ohio attorney and Democratic candidate for attorney general who has spent most of his career in private legal practice at a major Ohio law firm, where he worked on complex civil litigation. He is also a former member of the Upper Arlington City Council, where he was involved in local governance and municipal policy decisions.

Kulewicz's campaign for Ohio Attorney General centers on **strengthening consumer protections, increasing accountability for corporations and government officials**, and making the Attorney General's office more responsive to everyday Ohioans. He supports more aggressive enforcement against fraud, scams, and price manipulation, along with expanded efforts to combat corruption and misuse of public funds.

Kulewicz also emphasizes **protecting civil rights**, supporting law enforcement while ensuring it operates fairly and transparently, and using the Attorney General's office to pursue legal action that defends workers, families, and local communities across Ohio.

Trivia: As an attorney Kulewicz has argued cases before the U.S. Supreme Court.
