

ALABAMA

Voters in Alabama will select a new governor this year following term-limited Governor Kay Ivey's (R) exit from office. Voters will also choose a lieutenant governor, attorney general, and treasurer. All 105 house seats will be on the ballot as well as all 35 senate seats. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the executive offices and legislature.

Attorney General

Republican Nominee

Katherine Robertson

Deputy Attorney General Katherine Robertson secured the Republican nomination for Attorney General after defeating Alabama Supreme Court Justice Jay Mitchell in a runoff election on June 16, bringing an end to a contentious primary cycle.

Robertson has served as Chief Counsel to Attorney General Steve Marshall (R) for nearly a decade. Before joining Marshall's office, she served as counsel to Senator Jeff Sessions (R-AL) on the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee.

Her campaign draws on both her record in the Attorney General's Office and her vision for the role going forward. She has highlighted her work to **reduce violent crime** and tighten parole standards during her tenure and has [pointed to](#) her established relationships with law enforcement, the state legislature, and fellow Republican attorneys general as assets that would allow her to hit the ground running if elected.

Robertson has **closely [aligned](#) her campaign with the Trump administration**, pledging to advance the President's agenda and support an America First approach. She has also emphasized her record pushing back against the Biden administration during her time as Chief Counsel.

Framing herself as the **"law enforcement candidate,"** Robertson has named supporting law enforcement and enacting tougher laws on gangs, child exploitation, and illegal immigration among her top priorities.

She has also made **transgender athletes in sports** a campaign issue and has pledged to resist federal overreach while protecting free speech and religious liberties.

Robertson enters the general election as a heavy favorite. **Sabato's Crystal Ball [rates](#) the race as safe Republican**, and her Democratic opponent's limited profile and funding give her a clear path to victory in November.

Trivia: Robertson is an eighth-generation Alabamian.
