Idaho residents will head to the polls in November to elect a governor, lieutenant governor, attorney general, and treasurer. All 35 state senate and all 70 state house seats are also on the ballot. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the attorney general's office and the state legislature.

Lori Hickman is a seasoned attorney, earning her law degree from Brigham Young University's J. Reuben Clark Law School. She worked as Associate General Counsel for Micron Technology where she advised high-level corporate matters. She also worked for the United States District Court for the District of Idaho before joining a Boise law firm in 2014 where she represents and advises clients on a variety of business, litigation, and intellectual property matters. Hickman also provides pro bono legal counsel for guardian ad litem cases in child protection cases.

In announcing her campaign, Hickman called the attorney general "the people's lawyer," and emphasized that the office "must be grounded in ethics, sound legal analysis, and respect for the constitution." As attorney general, she has pledged to provide legal advice based on the Rule of Law and hiring based on ethics and skill rather than political ideology.

Hickman has also promised to be a staunch advocate for consumer protections, taking on **consumer fraud, scams, Medicaid fraud, and price-fixing schemes**.

She also called to **strengthen the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) task force** to better protect children's online safety.

Protecting the state's public lands and natural resources is another key priority for Hickman. She has vowed to fight against efforts to sell or restrict access to and usage of federally-owned lands.

Hickman has also indicated that she wants **to strengthen relationships with state agencies and law enforcement**. She has called for better funding and resources for law enforcement agencies, prosecutors, public defenders, correctional agencies, and the courts. She also believes that local law enforcement agencies should be allowed to make their own decision regarding their participation in federal immigration enforcement programs, rather than their participation being mandated.

Hickman will face incumbent Attorney General Raúl Labrador (R) in November's general election.
