Nebraska voters will elect a governor, lieutenant governor, attorney general, and state treasurer in 2026. Twenty-five (25) of the 49 seats in Nebraska's unicameral legislature are up for election. Republicans currently hold every statewide executive office and maintain a dominant position in state government and are expected to retain control following the 2026 elections.

Attorney General Mike Hilgers

Mike Hilgers is a lawyer, entrepreneur, and politician serving as Nebraska's 33rd Attorney General. Before being elected attorney general in 2022, he spent six years in the Unicameral representing the Lincoln area, where he rose to become Speaker of the Legislature. Hilgers also built a successful law firm from a one-person operation into a nationally recognized practice with more than 100 employees, earning recognition as one of the country's fastest-growing businesses.

His campaign [highlights](#) legal challenges against the Biden administration and the state of California. Hilgers touts his office's role in a suit against TikTok and Facebook for "misleading parents on content shown to their children."

Hilgers vehemently opposed the Biden administration's initiative that would have placed more electric semi-trucks on the roads, ultimately suing the administration and four trucking manufacturers.

He has pledged to protect Nebraska's water rights and has sued Colorado for allegedly violating Nebraska's rights to water from the South Platt River.

Trivia: Hilgers visited law enforcement in each of the state's 93 counties in his first year in office.
