

GEORGIA

Georgia has some of the most competitive executive races this year. The governor, lieutenant governor, and attorney general seats are all open. All 56 senate seats are up for election along with all 180 house seats. Both chambers are expected to remain in Republican control.

Attorney General

Democratic Nominee

Tanya Miller

Tanya Miller (D) is a prosecutor and civil rights attorney who was elected to the Georgia House of Representatives in 2023. She has two decades of experience as a trial lawyer, including prior service as Chief Senior District Attorney in the Fulton County District Attorney's Office.

Her [campaign](#) is focused on public safety, small business protection, and consumer fraud.

On **public safety**, Miller has pledged to support local law enforcement by expanding access to resources and training, while also prioritizing the prosecution of crimes against children.

On **consumer protection**, Miller plans to investigate the grocery supply chain, challenge unjustified utility rate hikes, and represent consumers before the Public Service Commission. She has also pledged to prosecute robocall operations and address what she describes as predatory lending practices.

Her agenda for the office also includes establishing a **Small Business Protection Unit** to serve as a resource for Georgia entrepreneurs and to enforce the state's price gouging laws during declared states of emergency.

This race stands out as one of the most closely watched contests on the Georgia ballot this cycle. Republicans have dominated down-ballot statewide offices, making the attorney general's seat a significant test of Democratic strength in a state that has grown increasingly competitive.

Trivia: Miller was an undefeated homicide prosecutor during her time as a supervising attorney in the Fulton County District Attorney's Office.
